Here is a thought from last week's homily, ...*The divisions God created at Babel are healed at Pentecost...now we understand that human talent needs to be tempered by faith and revered with humility.*

A young acquaintance of mine, Joseph Hollcraft, was killed by a drunk driver nearly two years ago. Here is a reflection written by his girlfriend.

Today's date is ridiculously special to me. My Facebook keeps reminding me that I have memories with people, and of those moments many were shared with Joseph because today was our day. And each date that has passed this year that has been significant to our story has slowly become less sad. Not because I don't recognize its importance, but because each month I'm able to breathe a little more. I used to think I couldn't exist without him. My plans were so intertwined with his and losing him made me stand still. However, things are brighter in the pines. I can look up and soak it all in. The moments with Joseph that became such hurtful reminders of his absence, have now turned into a feeling of remembrance accompanied by joy. It's a strange transition, but I believe it's a good one. It is a testament to the way the Lord has continued to heal me. And even though Joseph can't support me like he used to, he's still rooting for me alongside Jesus. I have been hesitant to share this because of how it may seem like a "moving on" type of post. But it's not. There's no "moving on" when the choice to do so was neither one of our decisions. Instead, this post is a response to how time can help heal. Grief never really stops but becomes lighter to bear. I have learned to no longer bear it by giving it to the One who has seen me on my worst days when missing Joseph hurts again. Taking steps without him have been immensely bittersweet, but I hear him say each time, "good job, do it again." So, on our day, I'm sharing this with all of you. To invite you into the experience I have had this year so far with loss.

friends + coffee, mass + prayer, new friendships + good music, venting sessions + wine, and long walks + baking have all contributed to the healing. There's no right or wrong way to do this whole healing thing. I used to think there was. There just are existing and recognizing that there is hope in each trial we face.

Reflect on those who have helped you heal and remind yourself to be grateful for the ways you've come out strong through that pain.

Celebrate the little victories.

E N D U R E in all things, dear friends.
