Here is a thought from last week's homily: *A yoke is a coupling. It ties together two things. A yoke for oxen binds together two oxen. One ox in a yoke makes no sense. To take upon ourselves the yoke of Jesus means that that we invite Jesus to walk with us. Our burden becomes lessened by half because he is at our side.*

Be grateful.

Life is fragile. The line between health and sickness, wholeness and injury is very thin. One of my canon law professors would say, "that line is so fine it would fit between the paint and the wall."

If you are healthy and whole, rejoice and be glad. Give thanks to God every day.

If you are sick or injured, rejoice and be glad! Really? Yes. We give thanks to God for EVERYTHING, even the crosses we carry.

The Catechism offers the distinction between moral and physical evil. Moral evil is our participation in sin. Something sinful and hurtful comes about as a result of our CHOICES. Physical evil is the result of original sin. Physical evils directly due to nature are sickness, accident and death. Poverty, oppression, and some forms of diseases are instances of evil arising from imperfect social organization. Natural disasters are the result of all of creation falling in the fall.

We are tempted to think that sickness and injury are a form of punishment that God inflicts on some people. Not so! If we suffered physical evil for our sins, none of us would be well or even alive. Physical evils can be random. They can be passed on in our genetic dispositions. They can be the result of social and organizational choices.

If you suffer, rejoice that you are suffering with Jesus. If you are well, be grateful for the day and for every blessing.
