Here is a quote from last week's homily: The false gods of today are more subtle than Moloch, a towering furnace of bronze that destroys life. Today's idols are fashioned not out of bronze but out of the ideals and cultural movements. They eat away at our convictions and dampen our courage. Today's idols lull us into apathy and beat us into the lowest common denominator of religion—that there is a nice god up there who is available should we need him but otherwise ought to stay out of our business.

I am preparing for a mission trip to Uganda. I will be going in August. First the immunizations—ouch! A traveler is not allowed into the country without being immunized for Yellow Fever. I received four others as well. I have purchased a fancy bug spray to spray on my clothing and a regular bug spray to spray on me. I have mosquito netting at the ready and a headlamp flashlight. I will be going to a village without electricity or running water. I am a little anxious about the latrine, which is a hole in the ground, with no seat. Today I bought biodegradable baby wipes.

I will be at an orphanage. It was founded by a young lady from Ohio named Laura Corcoran. Laura is a nurse. Her pattern has been to come to the US and work for some months to save up some money. She returns to Uganda and spends the money on her 200 children. She has recently obtained employment in Uganda having something to do with solar panels. She hopes to be able to support her kids, the travel and extended absences.

The orphanage is in the territory of a priest who has 53 churches in his "parish." He has Mass at each place a couple of times a year. For my visit, I will have Mass daily for the kids and villagers. The pastor has given me permission to administer the other sacraments (baptism, anointing of the sick, confessions) as needed. Who knows, I may baptize a hundred babies in the 12 days I am there. I will also be teaching the children Theology of the Body through an interpreter for 45 minutes a day.

Thank you for patience and generosity while I am away for these summer breaks.

Here at home: we are in need of people to head up our music ministry and religious education. Can you help? Do you know someone who can?
