Here is a thought from last week's homily: *Don't be surprised when you see weeds in the lawn. Don't be surprised when you see more weeds than lawn. Be like my daddy. To whatever portion you can reach, stretch out your hands. Your very presence, with the love and mercy of Jesus, may make green what was once weeds.*

The harvest will begin soon. The fields of grain are putting on their amber wave. Yesterday I saw a farmer walking in his sugar beet field. He had driven an Enduro motorcycle to the edge of the field. He had walked a good distance into the field and pulled a weed. The farmer was about 6' tall; the weed looked to be 5'6". That is an image that will stick with me for a while—to walk into a field in order to pull out one weed. I am sure he was checking the crop. I imagine that he paused to give to God what was heaviest on his heart.

Are you ready for the harvest? It is going to be a lot of work. Some sleepless nights. Lots of problem-solving. Lots of expense. I am no longer talking about wheat and beets, but souls. The harvest is plenty, but laborers are few. Are you willing to invite conversations about the faith? Are you willing to tell someone what God has done for you? It is a lot of work. We lose sleep over the ones we love. It takes creativity to figure out how to reach someone whose heart is closed to Jesus. Sometimes it even costs us money to bring someone the good news of Jesus—you may have to drive half way across the country or spend your data to talk to them.

Invite someone to attend Mass with you. They might say no. But they might say yes.
