Here is a thought from Deacon Mark's homily last weekend: "I am Deacon Mark. I wear vestments not coveralls. I purify sacred vessels not bathrooms."

Last weekend friends from Crookston surprised me by coming to Mass on Saturday evening. In the announcements you were invited to pray for me, given the challenging times for the Church. Without knowing this context, my friends asked me if I am sick. A plea for prayer like they heard must mean that I have cancer or heart disease. They were relieved when I told that I am ok. Thank you for the prayers. I pray for you daily.

Last weekend we had a wedding at Sacred Heart. The groom's last name is Moos. There was a sign at the groom's dinner that read, "onelessmoosontheloose," "One less moose on the loose." I thought the sign was clever. I made me chuckle. I did ponder its meaning well into the evening. It implied that marriage created a sort of captivity, as if marriage is the end of freedom. Quite the contrary.

For Christians, we believe the only slavery is sin. Marriage is an exercise of freedom. In fact, marriage isn't possible when the freedom of either of the spouses is inhibited by force or fear, addiction or even a lack of maturity. In these circumstances, we can celebrate a wedding and the couple becomes civilly married. But before God there is no marriage without freedom. Marriage is the total gift of self to the other. The marks of marriage are freedom, total gift of self, faithfulness and fruitfulness, an openness to children and the love of the marriage spilling over into charity.

So, I rewrote the sign. I rewrote it to say, "One more moose on the luce." One more because the bride became a Moos. Luce is an Italian word for light—one more Moos sharing the light of Jesus with the world. How wonderful! How amazing that you are luce for the world, married or not.

Thank you to all who spent time with Jesus this past week during our parish's 24-hour Adoration praying for Father David and for the abuse crisis in our beloved Catholic Church. We are especially grateful for those who spent an hour of their night. We would like to continue having a monthly 24-hour adoration on the 3rd Tuesday of each month, starting in October. We prayerfully ask that many of the same people who attended this week's adoration consider committing to adoration on a monthly basis. Others of you who perhaps could not attend this past week, may wish to in the future. Join us and experience the inner peace that infuses your soul as you converse with Jesus in the silence of adoration.
