Here is a thought from last week's homily: *St. Paul sums up the life of faith as simply as this: resist sin. Resist sin to the point of shedding blood. By this he means resist sin with all your strength.*

Last weekend there were envelopes in the pews for the Diocesan Annual Summer Appeal. This and other collections are wonderful ways to share a portion of our tithe beyond the walls of our parish and city. Here is how I administer my personal tithe: of my income, 5% I offer to the parishes, 4% to the poor and 1% to the Diocesan Annual Appeal. How do you administer your tithe? It is good to be intentional about our tithe—otherwise months and years go by without an appropriate expression of gratitude to God for the many blessings we have received.

When a friend of mine had just completed her master's studies and as April 15 approached, she sent her paperwork home to her Daddy for him to do her taxes. He had only one response to her, "Honey, you did it again. You gave away more than you made!"

As a general principle, we ought to consider a tithe of 10% of our income. What we all ought to do is to pray about this openly and earnestly. If God asks you to do other than 10%, you need to do it.

My parents gave their children an example of generosity. We saw them make out a check to St. Rose of Lima every week. They encouraged us to use our envelopes as well. Every kid in the parish was given a box of contribution envelopes. I remember my first full-time job in the summer of 1985. I could not wait for the first check so that my contribution could be more than a few dollars.

The bishop of any diocese needs the support of his parishioners in order to staff his office and accomplish all that he needs to do for the particular church entrusted to his care. We need to do our part by offering a tithe of gratitude to God for our bishop, our seminarians, our priests, and all the work done in the name of Bishop Hoepfner.
