A thought from last week's homily: *A word can be accepted or rejected for three reasons: because of the person who speaks it; because of the word itself; because of the person who hears it.*

Sometimes our communities experience grave difficulties, and it is hard to have the words to talk about them. Here is something that may help from the Catechism of the Catholic Church:

**2280** Everyone is responsible for his life before God who has given it to him. It is God who remains the sovereign Master of life. We are obliged to accept life gratefully and preserve it for his honor and the salvation of our souls. We are stewards, not owners, of the life God has entrusted to us. It is not ours to dispose of.

**2281** Suicide contradicts the natural inclination of the human being to preserve and perpetuate his life. It is gravely contrary to the just love of self. It likewise offends love of neighbor because it unjustly breaks the ties of solidarity with family, nation, and other human societies to which we continue to have obligations. Suicide is contrary to love for the living God.

**2282** If suicide is committed with the intention of setting an example, especially to the young, it also takes on the gravity of scandal. Voluntary co-operation in suicide is contrary to the moral law.

Grave psychological disturbances, anguish, or grave fear of hardship, suffering, or torture can diminish the responsibility of the one committing suicide.

**2283** We should not despair of the eternal salvation of persons who have taken their own lives. By ways known to him alone, God can provide the opportunity for salutary repentance. The Church prays for persons who have taken their own lives.

Dallas and Mary Flynn donated the defibrillator that we have at Church for use in the case of certain medical emergencies. The Knights of Columbus are sponsoring training for four volunteers from the parish through the First Aid class that will be conducted at the Frazee Rescue building on the edge of town. The class will be held on Saturday, February 27, 2016, from noon until 4:00 pm. Anyone interested in taking this training should contact Tim Stenger (218.847.2912). It would certainly be good if at least one of the volunteers usually attends Saturday evening Mass and one usually attends on Sunday mornings.
