Eucharist and the Hungry Crowd

It is so amazing how all our works go to feed our mouths, to have good shelter, and to decently clothe ourselves. Are there any other needs greater than these? The above said needs are the basic needs of every human person whatever may be the country or culture someone is from. Of all other needs, feeding our stomachs is the most basic. Today's world faces a big crisis in feeding people. Will you believe that, worldwide, nearly one billion people go hungry every day? Oxfam reports that the global financial crisis has led another 119 million people into hunger. This shows that the world is not producing enough grains to feed all. Is this a problem of increase in the world population? I don't think so. It is a matter of bad planning and distribution of resources of and to the farmers of the world. If many go hungry in the world, it is a crime.

The problem of hunger has direct connection with the Eucharist. Jesus did not want to send the crowd back home hungry. He multiplied the loaves and fish to feed them. His body's becoming the living bread satiated the hunger of many. Whoever eats His body has the obligation to feed others who are hungry. In the story of Lazarus and the rich man, the sin of the rich man was being indifferent to the hungry fellow brother sitting at his doors. When we are indifferent to those who are hungry in our country and in the world, we are indifferent to the suffering body of Christ. Every human person is connected with the Body of Christ because salvation has come to him/ her through the sacred body offered by Jesus on the Cross. His body shared in the Eucharistic table reminds us of our extended obligation to care for the hungry and needy.

When we feed the hungry, we feed Jesus and make His body alive in this world. If we say that we love the Eucharist, let us also try to do something to feed the hungry in our own communities. It can be little efforts and measures in which we contribute to feed the hungry. Let us be conscious of the food we waste. Let us not consume more than what our body needs. Let us save a little and share with our hungry brothers and sisters. In doing this, our Eucharistic celebration will become much more meaningful and joyful to each one of us.
