A thought from last week's homily: *If you are getting a little too big-headed, change a diaper.*

Thank you for your witness to the vocation and Sacrament of Marriage and to the goodness of family life!

For a moment, I want us all to slow down and talk about something you might not be paying attention to--something you might be overlooking in the life of your household and in your marriage. In case you haven't given it the attention it needs, as your Pastor I want to talk about it with you. That is, I want to talk with you about pornography. Specifically, about protecting your children and marriages from it and also finding paths to healing.

We are living in a pornified culture. You are aware of this. Your children were born into this very culture. You are living your marriages in the midst of it as well. For adults, the culture and the porn industry have tried to trick us into believing that pornography is a healthy form of entertainment for "mature" individuals. For our children, the culture and porn industry are gradually grooming our boys and girls to have a desire to view pornographic images, beginning with romantic comedies, advertisements for popular clothing brands, graphic video games, unfiltered access to YouTube, and open online search engines.

Since I know it's tempting to think that it's impossible your child has viewed or is viewing pornography, statistics are showing it's more and more likely. It's true that 72% of kids are exposed to pornography before 18 years of age. At the same time, 67% percent of kids admit to cleaning their browser history to hide internet use from their parents.

I have shared these two particular statistics with you not only to show that porn is a threat, but because perhaps you or those who are dear to you have already been exposed to pornography. One thing many are aware of is that porn is intrinsically evil, but families are refusing to acknowledge it as a problem in the life of our own families, when, in fact, their teenage boy or girl may already have been ensnared or it's a secret that one spouse has been keeping from another. If this is your family/your marriage, there is hope (and tools!) to get back on the right path. With this said, I am very pleased to announce that the Diocese of Crookston through the coordination of the Office of the New Evangelization, is partnering with Covenant Eyes—an accountability and software company—to offer you--14,000 households in the Diocese of Crookston--a free package to help you protect your marriage and family from the scourge of pornography and to facilitate healthy online habits.

The packages will be mailed to your homes on October 22nd, the Feast of Saint John Paul II. Please keep a look-out for this package. It will include a 60-day free trial to Covenant Eyes, "Unfiltered," a DVD parent workshop, a "Parent How-to-Guide" and more. And, in the meantime, find more resources at:
