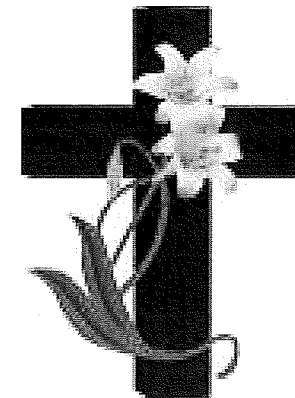




# Sacred Heart Catholic Church

Just think about the possibility of being at peace with God, with oneself, and with everyone else in our life. What a world it would be! If our daily life is full of peace in our hearts, that would be heaven on earth. What stops us in enjoying peace in our hearts? We know our human idiosyncrasies that do not allow us to relate with God and others in a peaceful way. When we know the ways of peace, then we are close to the Risen Lord whose peace reigns our hearts, our communities, and our social life. Let us strive to promote this peace in little ways so that we can see the power of God's reign claiming our lives for true peace and joy. I wish each and every one of you A HAPPY EASTER.
