Here is a thought from last week's homily: *If the devil drives a wedge between you and your parents, you are likely to make other bad decisions. The same is true for adults who work under supervision and all Catholics who live under the authority of the magisterium. Once a house is divided against itself, it will fall.*

God led the people of Israel into the desert. There he tested them in small matters to see if they would be obedient. Each morning they were to gather an omar of manna for each person in the tent, that is about 8 cups of bread crumbs for each person. This was to test their obedience. Obedience is a sign of trust and a surrender of selfishness. There was no need to take more than an omar, for God would provide for tomorrow when tomorrow came.

I wandered through a store closing sale on Monday. It was so challenging to not take more than an omar! Shirts were on sale—80% off! Do I need another shirt? No. Do I trust that God will provide for today and for tomorrow, too? I do...but...it is such a good deal!

When it comes to obedience, sales and good deals do not matter. I need an omar each day, and I should not take more than an omar. To do so simply extends my time in the desert, the place where I learn obedience. The place where I learn to trust God.

We have not learned these lessons well. Yet God still loves us and calls us to faithfulness.
