Here is a thought from last week's homily: *If, at any moment in my life, grace seems to be missing, it is not because God has failed to be generous. Rather, it is because I have failed to be open to grace or its messenger.*

During every Mass we walk to the altar to receive Holy Communion or a blessing. Is there anything that troubles you as you join in this procession? I notice parents can be preoccupied by their little children. Children seem to have trouble walking in a straight line. Sometimes they walk ahead or lag behind. After they receive a blessing, they can turn the wrong way. Sometimes they shy away from the blessing or reject it all together. Sometimes little children reach for Jesus in the Blessed Sacrament and tear up when they are denied. The procession is to be entered with reverence. But not in some preconceived notion of reverence that omits all participants but pious nuns. Your piety is colored by your vocation. If you have little children, you are necessarily occupied by them, even as you prepare to receive Jesus in Holy Communion. Jesus called children to himself. Surely he calls them to himself in our communion procession. Don't be distracted by children at Mass. Rather cherish the fact that the seeds of faith are watered each week. When you are aware of children at Mass, be aware that Jesus reaches for them. We would be lucky to accompany them into the arms of the Lord.

Sometimes I notice you when you process behind someone who is elderly or frail. You worry that they will miss a step or topple over. Sometimes the hands that reach for the Lord are unsteady and so are the legs that carry them. Jesus reached for children. He also reached for the sick. He wanted to lay his hands on them and heal them.

In the communion procession you may feel unsteady yourself. Walking is difficult. Your hands may not be as steady as they once were. We want you to be comfortable. If you want to walk in procession, come! Take your time. The Lord Jesus wants communion with you and wants you to receive communion. If you are not comfortable coming forward, mention to an usher on your way into the church that you would like Holy Communion brought to you in the pew. We are so pleased to bring Jesus to you.

Our prayer is always more complete when we pray with every generation, from newborn babies to the oldest among us. You may dream of a Mass without the distractions of children and others with needs. Let that dream go. It is better for us to be a body whole than to be a body piously quiet but incomplete.
