Here is a thought from last week's homily: ...So my dad asked me, "Is he for real?"

Have you ever been helping someone only to realize that some else needs help at the same time? You notice a grandma as she leaves the grocery checkout. She is walking with a cane and carrying two bags of groceries and a quart of milk. You offer to help, and she smiles with relief. As the two of you leave the store you notice a mommy struggling with her toddler while she carries the new born. Do you reload grandma with her groceries and help the mommy? Ok. But then just as you take the carrier with the baby, you see a man who has locked his keys in his car. He is frustrated and on the verge of exploding. So you pass the heavy baby back to the mommy, glance at grandma and run to the dry cleaner across the street to get a hanger to help the man unlock his car. But on the way to the dry cleaner you see...

Something like this happened to me this week. I was helping someone when I noticed another person in distress. My hands were full. All I could do is offer a prayer and hope that another Good Samaritan would have the heart to help. We feel badly about this, but we ought not feel guilty for it. Most of us can only help one person at a time. That is why all of us need to go about our days with our eyes open.

It makes a difference when I set my heart on helping. If I get up in the morning expecting to help people, I will be more likely to see them. I will be more likely to see their need, not as an interruption to my agenda, but as my work.

"...when did we see you hungry and feed you, or thirsty and give you something to drink? When did we see you a stranger and invite you in, or needing clothes and clothe you? When did we see you sick or in prison and go to visit you?"
