Here is a thought from last week's homily: "Most of the time we feel like St. Therese, small and childlike. Our lives are ordinary and routine. This is precisely where St. Therese sought her holiness—in doing faithfully the little things."

There has been a rift in my family for years. Surprised? Don't be. Every family bears the burden of the sins of its members. When the members seek repentance and forgiveness, the life of the family is more harmonious. When hearts become cold and hard, the effects of sin endure. Unity is forfeited. Life goes on, but with much less satisfaction, joy and peace.

This week I had a new insight. What if my heart is the heart that has grown cold? The original sins were not mine, but the effects of the sins have been spread to all of us. My heart...Lord, heal my heart. Help me to put on the Immaculate Heart of Mary and your own Sacred Heart as I encounter my family.

The person with whom I have struggled—I heard of a good deed he did last week. It never occurred to me that his life could be filled with good deeds! Once we decide who someone is, it is difficult to change our minds, even when there is evidence to the contrary.

Remember, in your family there is only one enemy—it is the evil one. The devil seeks death and destruction. Pray for protection over yourself and all the members of your family. Even old wounds can heal—if we let them.
