I am amazed at the adaptability and flexibility of my mother. She is 88 years old. Born in 1930, she was formed by the depression and every war since then. She gave birth to eleven children and worked as an RN for 40+ years. When it was time to move out of her home, she was excited to downsize. She has very few attachments to material things. If she ever needs to move again, she will gladly give up whatever doesn't fit in her new rooms. Some people who lived through the depression and its aftermath became hoarders to some degree—saving EVERYTHING under the sun and throwing nothing away. I remember cleaning the apartment of one such soul. He had saved drawers full of bread bags, twist ties and string. Not Mother. She recycles what can be recycled, throws what needs to be thrown and culls through her belongings periodically just to make sure nothing of excess stays in her life for very long.

Most of us can work at this model of diligent stewardship. Buy less, keep less, save more and double almsgiving. If you feel trapped by compulsion to obtain more and more, just stop for a moment. Consider that a little sacrifice on your part can make a big difference in the lives of the poor, especially those who live in third-world nations. With our eyes turned away from ourselves, we will soon realize that what we give up is not a sacrifice at all but a big step toward true freedom.

Speaking of my mother, I visited her last week. I drove her car for an outing, and I left her home with the keys in my pocket. I called her to let her know that I had her car keys and that this does not represent a family plan to keep her from driving. She responded, "I have a spare set of keys and you don't know where I keep them." Go Mom!!!
