Here is a thought I didn't get to in last week's homily...

We can make a distinction between a sin and a crime. A sin is an offense against reason, truth and right conscience (CCC1849). It is a failure to love God, neighbor or self. A crime is an action or omission that constitutes an offense that may be prosecuted by the state and punishable by law.

Jesus forgives sins, like the woman caught in adultery. People who sinned against Jesus personally, like the soldiers who nailed him to the cross, were forgiven by Jesus. Jesus asks us to forgive those who sin against us.

Our willingness to forgive may be a sign of our mental and emotional health at a moment in time. If you are tired, it may be hard to forgive your spouse for saying something stupid or neglecting to do something promised. When you are feeling anxious or depressed it can be difficult to understand the actions of others or even consider forgiveness.

Jesus found a way to see through these challenges and to forgive, and not seven times but seventy times seven times.

Some sins are also crimes. We are admonished to forgive even then. Our forgiveness does not remove from the state its obligation to prosecute criminals. We forgive those who sin against us, and we rely on the state to prosecute those who commit crimes. A priest who sexually abuses a minor can be forgiven and prosecuted for his crimes—these are not mutually exclusive. A bishop who is negligent in protecting children while at the same time protects abusers ought to lose his office and be forgiven.

We hear the echo of the words of Jesus and we have confidence that he speaks them even to us, "Has no one condemned you? Neither do I condemn you. Go, and sin no more."
