Here is a thought from last week's homily: *Peter and the apostles certainly knew how to fish. They had a boat, a net and plenty of time. They forgot one thing: they forgot to bring the risen Jesus.*

How often do we do things we don't want to do? Work has a conference, a hated subject at school, a family gathering—we find ourselves in places we would rather not be. At all times and in all places, we have the opportunity to witness to our faith in Jesus Christ. If we focus our attention on what we don't like, we will not communicate the joy of the gospel.

This is not merely adjusting our attitude or pasting on a fake smile. It is an act of surrender to the power of the Holy Spirit. It is believing that opportunities for love and mercy are everywhere and that God wants to use us to bring life and light to the world.

Think about it. We can avoid a family gathering because of some old fight. If we go to stew and pout and to make the reunion miserable for everyone, we will likely accomplish that goal. If we go open and prayerful, begging the Holy Spirit to lead us, then we may participate in God's work of redemption.

Jesus is risen, truly he is risen. His life is for all of us.
