Here is a thought from last week's homily: *The problem with recreating Eden is that no one can live there.*

I am amazed at how God provides for us. Today, I am unaware how God is providing for me not only for the present but building a store for my future.

Many, MANY, months ago Sacred Heart Church had the opportunity to purchase some used PA equipment. At the first thought of it, I was confident that we should have it.

When it was delivered we sorted through the stuff and returned it to the boxes in which it came and put it in a basement classroom for storage. When classes resumed it needed to be moved so we put it in a corner of the choir loft. Each time it was moved I looked at it and wondered, "How will you serve us?"

When we decided to have COVID Masses on Sunday afternoon's at the cemetery I was aware that we would need a sound system. I smiled when I remembered the heap of equipment in the choir loft. God is so good. God provides for us.

We have had 10 Sunday Masses at the cemetery. Last week we had our third funeral at the cemetery. All made easier because God provides for us.

After the second funeral at the cemetery, one of the funeral directors, who is incredibly grateful that we have the capacity for out-door funerals, put his hand on the cemetery altar and said to me, "This altar has already paid for itself ten times over."

It is hard to remember that God is providing not only for today but for tomorrow. This is especially hard to remember when today has an abundance of suffering. Still, it is true.
