Here is a thought from last week's homily: *John the Baptist was not a player; he was a prophet. His only agenda was transparency and his message was clear—repent, the Kingdom of God is at hand.*

We celebrated Confirmation at Sacred Heart on September 19. On one hand, it was another COVID event. The bishop and the candidates wore masks during the confirmation rite, music was limited, as was the seating. On the other hand, it was CONFIRMATION! The Holy Spirit breaks through every obstacle to strengthen those who are committed to Jesus Christ. COVID was no obstacle for the power of the Holy Spirit—this I could tell by the contagious joy that emanated from the newly confirmed.

What may be an obstacle for us is nothing to God. We are held back by fear and finances, while God says, "Peace be with you!" and "Trust in me!" We are held back by perceptions of our own limitations, while God says, "Eye has not seen, nor ear heard, nor have entered into human hearts the things God has prepared for those who love him."

When I was a kid and facing adversity, my dad would say, "Das ist kein hugel fur einen kletterer!" (That's no hill for a climber.) If you are facing adversity of any kind, it is climbing time. Lace up your boots and dust off your walking stick and take the first step. The rest is up to God, and *God never disappoints!*

Question of the Week: What one specific thing can I do with my time and talents to produce fruit in the vineyard I call home?

I praise God for giving me this view from my deck. It brings me His peace that surpasses all understanding. He brings me this every time He sends one of His sunsets; and He does that frequently.
