Here is a thought from last week's homily, *Paying taxes is not antithetical to the exercise of one's duty toward God, nor does serving God exempt one from supporting legitimate governments.*

As the summer progressed, I moved from woodworking to small engine repair for my hobby time. I was stumped while working on an old Tecumseh 16 horse engine, which was the motivation to call my older brother, Jim. Jim is a mechanic by trade and has worked many jobs. He has accumulated three lifetimes of experience and knows a little about everything and a lot about many things. After describing my dilemma, he knew exactly what I was talking about and told me how to fix it. He reminded me, "Never take apart something when you don't know what it is."

I have been sitting with that piece of advice for a few days. When it comes to taking things apart, I am braver than most. My courage comes from the fact that I have siblings who can come to my rescue. When I am removing the first screw in any project, in the back of my mind I know that an expert is a phone call away. If I have a question about Mexican cooking, I call Jr. or Mike. If I have a question about a car, I call Paul. If I have a question about sewing, Jeanne is the go-to gal. Electricity or plumbing? Mark it is. Insurance or finance, Dan is the man.

It is important for us to form community. Questions about cooking a quilting are important when nothing of greater importance is pressing. We really need one another it times of great joy and sorrow. We need family and friends when we are stressed or depressed or have doubts about important decisions. It is important to have friends and family close even when we don't need them. There is security in knowing that we are not alone in the world. There is peace and joy knowing that there is someone near to share a meal and a movie.

Tecumseh is a town in Michigan. I can imagine kids playing in the yard in the late hours of the afternoon in the fall of 1973, waiting for dad to come home from a day at the factory, building the motor that ended up in the rectory garage. From there that motor was sent to another factory that built lawn tractors, with other moms and dads. From there it was sent to a retail store, supporting more families. It was purchased by a family who used the lawn tractor to care for the home where more kids were raised.

Go ahead, be brave. Take something apart. If you cannot fix it, it will be the occasion to connect with a sibling or a friend.
