Zoom.
When I was a kid, zoom was a word to indicate that a car in my make-believe town was moving quickly. I was pleased when a major car brand took this word as their motto, "Zoom, Zoom." Today the meaning is altogether different. I am not sure zoom is a noun or a verb. Do I zoom? Do I go to zoom? Do I attend a zoom?

Grammar aside, virtual meetings are a mixed blessing. My first virtual meeting was in canon law school. One of the professors lived on the West Coast of Canada and the school was in Ottawa, above New York State. The professor met with us in person for the first class. That was a wonderful gift. I got to see her and experience her personality in more than two dimensions. This physical meeting made the virtual classes easier because I encountered her.

Encounter is to face someone, to meet her and to experience her. Prayer is an encounter with Jesus. It is to express a desire and an openness to have a personal relationship with him. He promised to be with us until the end of time. His presence is not digital. It is physical when we receive him in Holy Communion. It is always personal.

It is burdensome and tiresome to have barriers in our personal relationships. It seems that we will have to endure them for a while longer. I am noticing that this endurance is becoming more difficult. It is harder to be patient and charitable toward those who are acting differently than us.

Listen to St. Paul,
Put on then, as God's chosen ones, holy and beloved, compassionate hearts, kindness, humility, meekness, and patience, bearing with one another and, if one has a complaint against another, forgiving each other; as the Lord has forgiven you, so you also must forgive. And above all these put on love, which binds everything together in perfect harmony. And let the peace of Christ rule in your hearts, to which indeed you were called in one body. And be thankful.

Go ahead, zoom into perfect harmony.
