Fr. David's Homilies—frazeesacredheart.org.Homilies

Here is a thought from last week's homily: *When we are patient, long-suffering and kind, our life is a reflection of God's love.*

A French priest joined the Marianist Missionaries and was sent to the island of Futura, a good distance off the coast of Australia. The year was about 1835. Daily he was burned by the sun and famished with hunger. His confreres remembered that even in these conditions, he remained in good spirits, courageous and energetic.

With only a few converts to Christianity as the fruit of his labor, St. Peter Chanel was a martyr for the faith in 1841. Shortly before his death he wrote, "It does not matter if I die. Christ's religion is so deeply rooted on this island that it cannot be destroyed by my death."

What did he see that engendered in him such hope? By outward appearances, the fruits of his efforts were meager. By objective standards, a laborer in any other field would have abandoned the job and declared the effort a dismal bust. What did he see?

St. Mother Teresa encouraged us to know that we are not to measure our efforts by any objective view of success, but by our fidelity to God's call. A French-speaking Marianist priest looked into his own heart and knew that he was faithful. He saw God's hand at work. God's hand is creative and fruitful.


