Here is a thought from last week's homily: *Mary was unique. She was the mother of God. You and every person on earth, before there is anything unique in us, are first children of God, radically the same. We are children of God subject to Jesus Christ, the way, the truth, and the life.*

I have been pouting for about three months. The new battery I got for my scooter last year was dead this spring. I have been putting off replacing for no reason other than I am pouting. A battery ought to last for more than one year in a scooter, or so I think.

The new battery has a warranty of six months. It will expire in February, which is of course the peak of scooter weather in Minnesota. In April or May of 2022, I will put the new battery back in the scooter, after winter storage, and hope for the best.

When I was checking out, the guy at the till smiled at me and said, "You will be pleased. This new battery is as good as the old one." I am not sure what his intention was. To my ears it was discouraging--the old battery was not pleasing at all.

A portion of joy in life comes from managing our own expectations. If I had known on the day I bought it that the heavy whipping cream in my fridge (for my morning coffee) will expire on August 18, so why will I be mad when my coffee is sour on August 23? If my in-laws have been a challenge for as long as I have known them, why am I fit to be tied every December 16?

A battery has a life expectancy. Cream will expire. People who annoy me are not evil--they are merely different. We can pout and be mad if we want. We can talk about the in-laws from Christmas to the Fourth of July. It is good to remember that one day our remains will be placed into the earth. We will have expired. Our due date will have arrived. The perspective of eternity ought to make us more charitable. For we who are dust, eternity ought to help us manage our expectations.

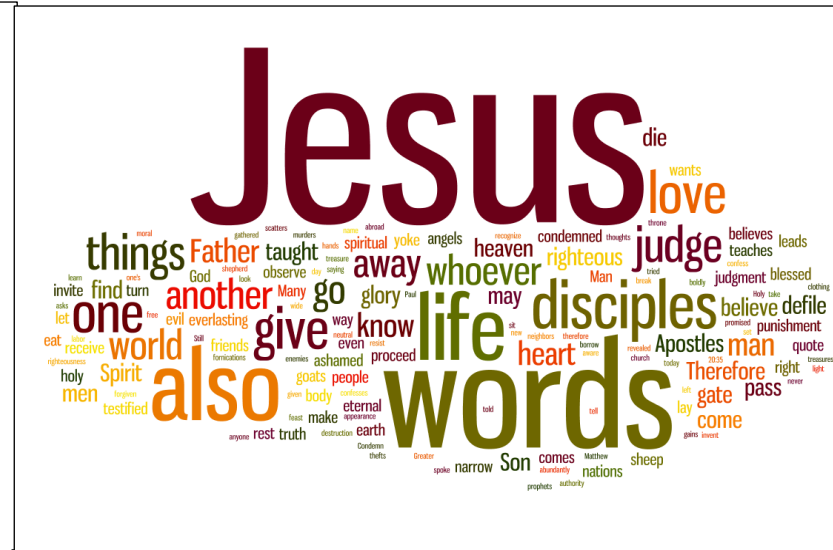
