Here is a thought from last week's homily: *If your right hand causes you to sin, cut it off. This is hyperbole. An exaggeration to make a point. The point: are we putting forth a good faith effort to avoid sin?*

Nathanael is described as a "True Israelite. There is no duplicity in him." He is not guilty of any sin. He will never conceal or misrepresent the truth.

All of this is true before he meets Jesus. Jesus acknowledges Nathanael's goodness when he said to him, "I saw you under the fig tree." In the Old Testament, being in the shade of a fig tree was a symbol of the peace of the messianic age. Jesus wants more for Nathanael. He calls him to himself.

Jesus wants us to know and experience more than the peace of the messianic age. He wants us to know the Messiah!

If you don't have any place that feels like a shelter from anxiety and pain, if you don't have your personal fig tree, you have something better. You have Jesus! If you have a refuge, invite Jesus in and you will experience more than a break from the world, you will experience the one who calls us not merely to peace, but to eternal life, peace without end.
