St. Bridget of Sweden was the most celebrated saint of the Northern kingdoms, born about 1303; died 23 July, 1373...She believed that Christ Himself appeared to her, and she wrote down the revelations she received from him, which were in great repute during the Middle Ages... She accomplished the greatest good in Rome...by her pious and charitable life, and her earnest admonitions to others to adopt a better life, following the excellent precedents she had set in her native land. The year following her death her remains were conveyed to the monastery at Vadstena. She was canonized, 7 October, 1391, by Boniface IX.

The Twelve-Year Prayers of St. Bridget on the Passion of Jesus: These prayers, given by Our Lord to St Bridget of Sweden, are to be prayed for twelve years. Our Lord promised to all who pray them the five graces listed below:

1. The soul who prays them suffers no Purgatory.
2. The soul who prays them will be accepted among the Martyrs, as though he had spilled his blood for his faith.
3. The soul who prays them can choose three others whom Jesus will then keep in a state of grace sufficient to become holy.
4. No one in the four successive generations of the soul who prays them will be lost.
5. The soul who prays them will be made conscious of his death one month in advance.

If the supplicant should die before completing the 12-year prayers, our Heavenly Father will accept them as having been prayed in their entirety, as the genuine intention was there.

Multiple popes, from as far back as Pope Clement XII in the 1730's until Pope Benedict XVI, validated our Lord Jesus' apparitions to St. Bridget of Sweden and the prayers he gave her.
