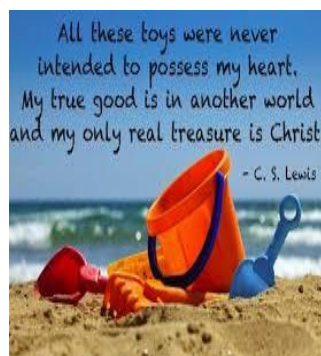

The 2022 - 2023 Safe Environment training module for the Diocese of Crookston is now available. Our Safe Environment year began on July 1st, 2022 and runs through June 30th, 2023. Safe Environment certification is necessary for every adult volunteer or employee age 18 or older in the Diocese of Crookston who has the potential for unsupervised contact with children or vulnerable adults.

Certification includes a criminal background check, training related to recognizing and reporting child abuse, and agreement to abide by the Diocesan Safe Environment Policy and Code of Conduct.
