The Twelve Days of Christmas

We're all familiar with the carol "The Twelve days of Christmas." It recounts a series of gifts that someone's true love gave to someone. There is a different gift or set of gifts for each of the twelve days of Christmas up until the evening before Epiphany (which always used to happen on January 6th, though we now push it to the closest Sunday for the sake of convenience. Ugh!). It is a loveable song full of amusing gifts. It involves memorization and counting, and is fun to sing together. It might also have been a catechetical tool to help children learn about the Faith. For each day of Christmas, the gift(s) can be associated with certain Christian things. Here is the list:

- 12 Drummers Drumming = the twelve points of doctrine in the Apostle's Creed
- 11 Pipers Piping = the eleven faithful apostles
- 10 Lords A-leaping = the Ten Commandments
- 9 Ladies Dancing = the nine Fruits of the Holy Spirit
- 8 Maids A-milking = the eight beatitudes
- 7 Swans A-swimming = the seven gifts of the Holy Spirit, the seven sacraments
- 6 Geese A-laying = the six days of creation (highlighting life)
- 5 Golden Rings = The first five books of the Old Testament, the "Pentateuch," which gives the history of man's fall from grace
- 4 Calling Birds = the Four Gospels
- 3 French Hens = Faith, hope, and charity, as the principle theological virtues
- 2 Turtle Doves = The Old and New Testaments

What about the partridge in a pear tree? It is Jesus Christ, as symbolically represented by a mother partridge protecting her helpless nestlings. Luke 13:34 recounts the words of Christ:

O Jerusalem, Jerusalem, killing the prophets and stoning those who are sent to you! How often would I have gathered your children together as a hen gathers her brood under her wings, and you would not!

Last of all...What about the concept of someone's true love? God should be *our* true love, and what gift did he give us on the First Day of Christmas? The Christ Child born of a Virgin Mother!

Question of the Week: How can the seeds of divinity sown in me bloom for all to realize? Do I recognize the seeds of divinity in me? In others?
