One of the chief documents of the Second Vatican Council was the "Constitution on the Sacred Liturgy: Sacrosanctum Concilium." This document proposed ways in which the Church might renew her sacred liturgy to better evangelize and sanctify Christians throughout the world. Paragraph 100 of this document said, "Pastors of souls should see to it that the chief hours, especially Vespers, are celebrated in common in church on Sundays and the more solemn feasts. And the laity, too, are encouraged to recite the divine office, either with the priests, or among themselves, or even individually." To begin to fulfill that sacred obligation imposed upon me, on Sunday afternoon, there will be a 3:00 p.m. Holy Hour with Eucharistic Adoration, Vespers, and Benediction. It is my hope to continue these Holy Hours with Vespers on the Third Sunday of each month. Please join us!
