It was a healing balm for the soul. Of course, I must also thank the many, many of you who came to pray. I am proud to be the pastor of parishes that have such a good flock. The Lord will surely reward our faithfulness, as we can catch a glimpse of each day.

Today, at 3:00 p.m. there will be a Eucharistic Holy Hour at Sacred Heart Church in Frazee. There will be Evening Prayer, Adoration, the Divine Mercy Chaplet, and Benediction. There will be an extra hour of confessions from 2:00 until 3:00 p.m.

Remember: if you wish to obtain the plenary indulgence associated with this day, you must

1. in any church or chapel, in a spirit that is completely detached from the affection for a sin (even a venial sin) take part in the prayers and devotions held in honor of Divine Mercy

or,

in the presence of the Blessed Sacrament exposed or reserved in the tabernacle, recite the Our Father and the Creed, adding a devout prayer to the merciful Lord Jesus (e.g. Merciful Jesus, I trust in you!")

2. make a thorough confession and receive absolution,
3. receive Holy Communion worthily,
4. and pray for the intentions of the Pope. (I suggest an Our Father, Hail Mary, and Glory Be.)
