


# Ignatius of Loyola

Consider today's responsorial psalm. The refrain is, "Lord, I love your commands." Do you love what the Lord commands? He commands some awfully difficult things. Do you love them, or are you angry about having demands made of you that you know are right and with which you must comply for salvation's sake? Too many of us are bitter about certain teachings of the Church. We either don't comply altogether, or we comply, but are mad about it...or we can comply and be joyful about it, because we know that we are safe and right in following all that the Lord commands. We know that what he commands is for our good and the good of others. We can trust his commands and be at peace with them, even if they are hard to follow. The absolute worst thing we can do is refuse to follow his commands while simultaneously denying that they are his commands (or denying that the Church has correctly interpreted his commands) in an effort to self-justify whatever it is we want to do. I invite you to pray with this psalm every day this week and seek to adopt the attitude of its author.
