Elijah didn't sense God in the roaring wind, in the earthquake, or in the raging fire, but he instantly knew that it was God Himself in the tiny, whispering sound. Each portion of Scripture can be understood in several ways and have several meanings, that is why we need the teaching authority of the Church to interpret the Sacred Scriptures for us. One meaning of this passage from the First Book of Kings can be in reference to the human conscience. We hear God in our conscience. At least so long as we have a well-formed conscience, and not a warped conscience. This is a little like how Elijah sensed God in the tiny, whispering sound. The Star of the North Eucharistic Congress to be held Friday, May 17 and Saturday, May 18, 2024, at the Sanford Center in Bemidji, MN. Bishop Andrew Cozzens, Bishop Robert Barron, Sister Jude Andrew, Father Mike Schmitz and Aly Aleigha will highlight this event that kicks off the Marion Route of the National Eucharistic Procession.

May 19th Kick-Off to the Marion Route of the National Eucharistic Procession – Itasca State Park Pentecost Sunday, May 19, 2024 begins the National Eucharistic Pilgrimage – four Eucharistic Processions that will make their way to Indianapolis for the National Eucharistic Congress. The Marion Route Procession begins in the Diocese of Crookston at Itasca State Park – the headwaters of the Mississippi River. Details will be shared in September, in conjunction with the Star of the North Eucharistic Congress.
