This Sunday (September 3rd) our bishop will be coming to Sacred Heart Church in Frazee for a 3 o'clock Hour of Mercy! It will include Adoration of the Blessed Sacrament, a conference by the bishop about bringing healing to your families, a family blessing with the oil of Saint Joseph by Fr. Hamness, and an opportunity for your families to be prayed over individually by Bishop Cozzens. Sacramental Confession will be available afterward, during which time there will also be snacks and other refreshments during a social hour. Spread the word, because anyone, from anywhere, is welcome.

This year the month of October has been dedicated to preaching about the Holy Eucharist. Our bishop has selected a specific set of Eucharistic-themed readings for each Sunday of the month, which are different from the readings we would normally be having on those Sundays. (Note to Readers at Mass: copies of these different readings are available to be picked up, so that you can prepare to proclaim them when you are scheduled to read.) The Doctrine of the Holy Eucharist and the Real Presence of Jesus Christ (Body, Blood, Soul, & Divinity) will be systematically developed in each subsequent Sunday over the course of the month, so make plans to be here each week to make sure you get the full picture. Also, small-group prayer and study sessions are beginning next month that are going to focus on the Eucharist.

Bishop Cozzens (the director of the National Eucharistic Revival Team) visited with Pope Francis recently to share the team's efforts on the revival. The Pope affirmed the critical need for an increase of faith among Catholics in the Real Presence of Jesus in the Eucharist. He said "it is my hope that the Eucharistic Congress will inspire Catholics throughout the country to discover anew the sense of wonder and awe at the Lord's great gift of Himself in the Eucharist."

Father Hamness's reflection continued...

You may remember that a few months ago I asked you to complete a survey on preferred Mass times. The reason that the topic even came up is because I was dissatisfied with the fact that after Mass each Sunday there are coffee and refreshments and socialization, but I always have to leave for Mass in Callaway very quickly, so I don't really get to stick around and spend time with the many, many people that remain here to visit. And then...if I do stay around longer, I get to Mass in Callaway late, and then I get scolded by them for being late for Mass...and then after Mass in Callaway, I am scheduled to hear confessions, so I don't really get to visit with any of the people in Callaway either, because they have mostly gone by the time I get out of the confessional. What it amounts to is that I am hardly able to spend any time with parishioners on a Sunday, because I am rushing, and driving, and in the confessional. I had thought there might be a possibility to change the schedule a bit, so I could visit with more people on Sundays.

The survey was rather definite. People in Frazee do not want a later Mass on Sunday morning, but there was some openness to an earlier time. After tabulating the surveys, I had originally decided not to change anything, but as I discussed this with the Parish Council, they insisted that it was important that I have more time to visit with people, and they strongly encouraged me to move Frazee's Sunday morning Mass time to 8:00 a.m. so that I would have more time to spend after Mass seeing those who have stuck around for refreshments. We will begin having Mass on Sunday mornings at 8:00 a.m. starting on October 1st.

I have been asked many times over, since I arrived a year ago, if I could start a regular Latin Mass on Sundays, and now that I have been in the parish for a year and lived with the ebb and flow of things, I am ready to take on an additional Mass in my Sunday schedule. If you don't care for Latin Masses, that's just fine, because this really should not affect you if you don't want anything to do with it. I will begin to offer a weekly Sunday Mass in Latin at 12:15 p.m. for those who are interested, starting on September 17th. We'll see how it goes, and if people remain interested, it will continue, and if they lose interest, it will come to an end. I have the freedom in my schedule to add another Mass on Sundays, so it seems reasonable to offer it for those who would like it.

Some people may be wondering why I am doing this because of what the Pope wrote a few years ago. Let me explain: In August of 2021, Pope Francis issued a document that increased the oversight of the Mass celebrated according to the texts and rubrics in force *before* the Second Vatican Council. That is not the Latin Mass that I will be offering. I will be offering the Mass in Latin according to the texts and rubrics that were issued *after* the Second Vatican Council, and there is no restriction whatsoever on Masses offered in this manner. The Parish Pastor may decide all by himself if he thinks it is prudent to offer Mass in Latin this way. To further ease your consciences, however, allow me to tell you that I have consulted Bishop Cozzens and he has given his blessing to this endeavor.

Priesthood Sunday is a special day set aside to honor Priesthood and will be celebrated throughout the United States Sept 23rd and 24th. It is a day to reflect upon and affirm the role of the Priesthood in the life of the Church.

You may bring your own cards or fill out the cards provided with your spiritual gifts (Rosaries, Masses, Prayers) and words of gratefulness for our Priest. Some Thank You cards and a card box will be provided in the gathering space. Children may draw a picture or write a note to Father Hamness.

Father would like to recommend that you remember and pray for the Priests who conferred the Sacraments upon you, especially Baptism and Marriage. Please consider mailing them a card. If they are deceased, or you are unable to know their whereabouts, you may put their names in the 2nd box provided (and so marked), and Father Hamness will do a private blessing for them at a later time. We ask you all to please bring bars or cookies, so to provide "Refreshments" after both Masses.
