Liturgical Music

I will be gone this week from Wednesday at noon until Saturday at noon to attend a Liturgy Society conference in the Twin Cities, I will also get to visit my brother's family and see a few priest friends.

Starting with the first Sunday in October, we are going to begin implementing one of the bishop's directives for the whole diocese for the duration of the Eucharistic Revival. The bishop has asked that we observe a few minutes of silence after the Blessed Sacrament has been returned to the Tabernacle and before the closing prayer of the Mass. It is his hope that these few moments of silence will give us all a chance to think more intentionally about the gift we have just received, before we get distracted with exiting the church and thinking about what is next on our agenda. It may be an uncomfortable quiet period for some of us at the beginning, but I think that we can grow into it as a parish. It's a bit like just sitting at the table after we dine, rather than rushing out to get back to work; it will help us to appreciate the Lord's presence within in us and help us to feel his close connection with us.

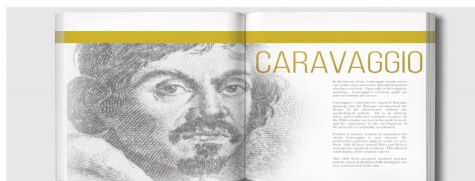
