As I've mentioned a few times, due to the Eucharistic Revival, our bishop has asked that all parish use alternate Scripture readings at Sunday Mass throughout the month of October, readings which concentrate our attention on the Most Holy Eucharist. This word we use, the Eucharist, is a Greek word that means thanksgiving...as in at this liturgical service we are giving thanks to God for the gift of our lives and for the gift of Salvation purchased by the Body and Blood of Jesus Christ. In the Church Eucharist has also taken on the meaning of that which we receive at this service of thanksgiving: the Lord's flesh and blood. In this month, the Scriptures highlight what we believe, both about the Mass, as a religious liturgical service, and they highlight what we believe about the True Presence, meaning that the bread and wine are transformed into the Body and Blood of Jesus Christ.

### **Father Hamness's reflection continued from the front page....**

Last week's scriptural theme was about how the Jewish Passover foreshadowed what would happen at the Last Supper and in the Lord's death on the Cross, and thus in the Catholic Mass. This week's Scriptures concentrate our attention on the fact that Jesus really meant it when he said that the bread and wine at the Last Supper were his Flesh and Blood.

You will soon see some kneelers at the front of the Church. They are available to be used by those who wish to kneel to receive Holy Communion. They are not meant to pressure anyone into kneeling who has not felt interiorly called to kneel for Communion; they are just here to facilitate those who choose to do so. As I have said before, you have four basic options for reception of Holy Communion: standing and in the hand, standing and on the tongue, or kneeling in the hand, or kneeling on the tongue. The Church allows them all, and I am not making any judgement about whoever chooses to do what, although I will be relieved to have the kneelers because it is sometimes a bit nerve-wracking to see some people kneeling who find it very difficult to get up again. Hopefully these kneelers will prevent any physical mishaps or unintentional profanation of the Holy Eucharist. A donor who wishes to remain anonymous paid for them entirely, and no parish funds were spent on them. We will continue to line up for Communion in the usual manner (up and down the main aisle) on Sundays, and we will continue to line up across the front of the Church on weekdays.
