Reflection for Sundays Year A

1Thessalonian 2:9-13

"...God's word, Which is also at work in you believers" (v13)

If you're a beadmaker, you'll know that yeast has the most amazing properties. It looks rather odd, nondescript even- but as soon as it is mixed with sugar and warmed with water, it starts reacting, bubbling up- and once it's added to the flour, you can feel the difference. Suddenly the flour comes alive- because the yeast is a living organism.

The word of God works very much like yeast. It's alive with energy and power; it has effect. Paul writes of God's word, "which is also at work-energetai-in you believers" (v13) The life of God is activating in them, bubbling with creativity and bearing joy as its gift. And this divine word, closely identified with Jesus who is the Word, undergoes a similar process to that of yeast for the energy to be released. Paul employs the term "akoese" as a clue to this process- meaning hearing, obeying, taking in, admitting. The Thessalonians had to receive the word of the Gospel into themselves, to take it inyou could say, to give away, to surrender to it. The result is liftoff into life, with all its divine energy and fullness.

The same divine energy can be active, now deep down in us hidden in our own breathings, by faith, generating strength for today.


