### From the Desk of Fr Hamness:

#### A Deer Hunting Story

Four good friends from a local parish joined together on Saturdays at a local farm during deer season. There was the farmer who provided the land, a doctor who was skilled at cutting up the meat, a lawyer who made all the arrangements, and a priest who they just felt sorry for.

One Saturday, the group had hunted together all day with no luck. When they got back to the farmstead they saw a magnificent buck emerge from the woods. He was huge! This was a mature, 12-point buck. 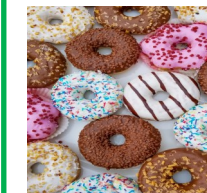
