We have finally been able to have a long overdue Parish Council and Finance Council meeting. One of the items of concern is that since we took out the loan for our new roof, just before I arrived at this parish, we have neglected to work the payments for this loan into our yearly budget. I guess the thought must have been that donations would come in far more quickly or that the monthly maintenance envelopes would cover the monthly payments. This has not been the case. We have not had the contribution of sufficient new monies each month to cover the loan payment, and so we have been drawing the remainder of what is needed from our loan payment from our general fund, which is slowly reducing the balance in our checking account. We really do need some additional donations to cover our monthly loan payment, or even better, to make the payment and pay extra on the principle. If each household that presently makes a weekly offering would increase what they usually give each week by \$10 or \$15, then we would be able to make the loan payment each month without difficulty. Please consider your offering as we approach the Season of Charity. Thank you for all you give now, and for supporting our thriving parish.

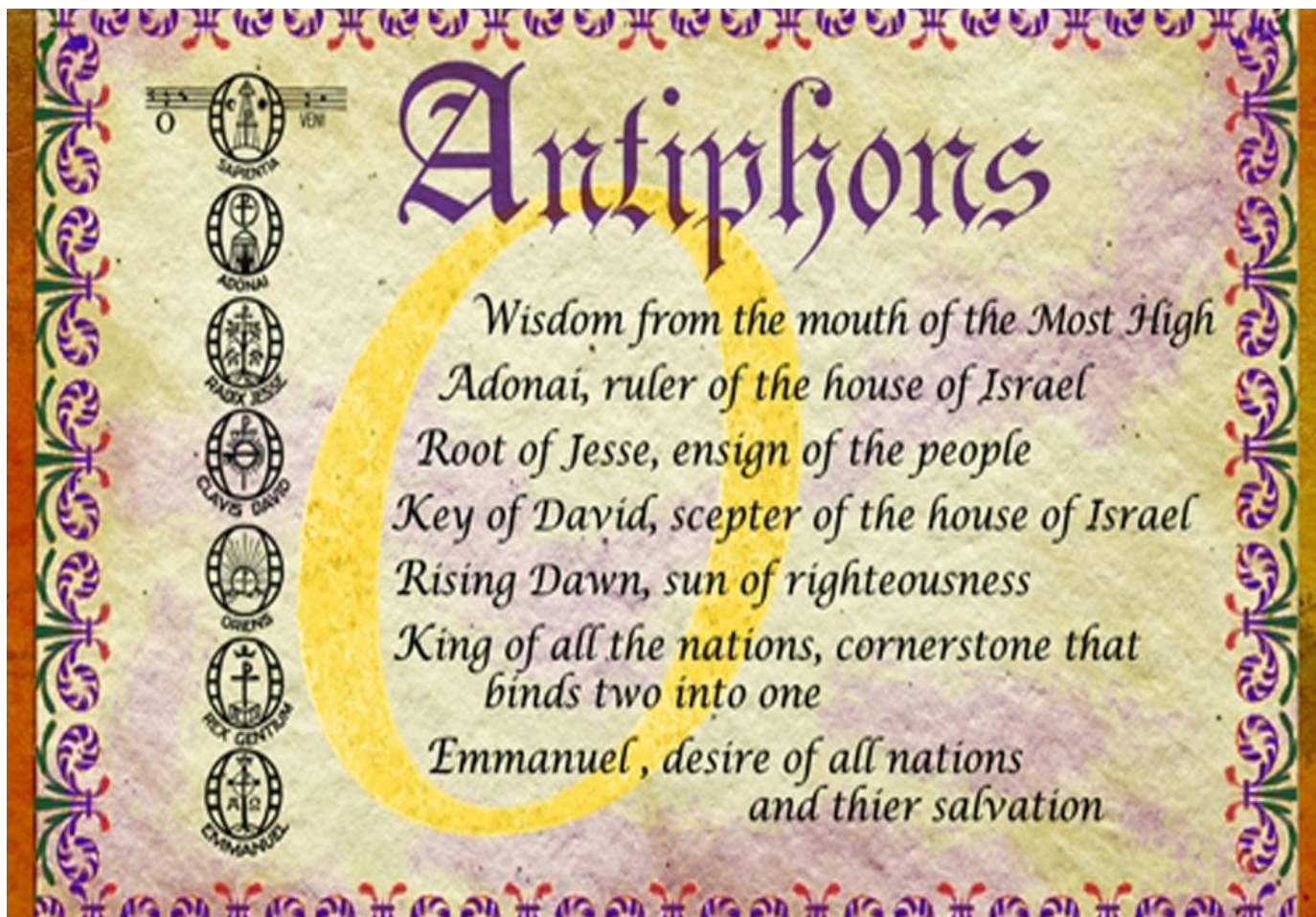

**Faith**-The second candle, which is purple, symbolizes faith. It is sometimes called the "Bethlehem Candle" It's origin in the prophet Micah who prophesied Jesus would be born in Bethlehem





## What's in a song?!

Over the course of the next four weeks of Advent we will be singing combinations of the traditional "O" Antiphons at Mass.

## Just what are the "O" Antiphons?

Traditionally sung on the seven days preceding Christmas Eve, these choral prayers were based on Messianic titles used by the prophets in the Old Testament. Intended for Vespers (Evening Prayer), a different verse is sung each evening of Advent beginning December 17. From the first letter of each oblation of Jesus, an acrostic is formed, which is a poem or series of lines in which certain letters form a message when read in sequence. These oblations are: O Sapientia (Wisdom), Adonai (Lord), Radix (Root of Jesse), Clavis (The Key of David), Oriens (Dayspring), Rex (King), Emmanuel (God With Us). When reversed, we have the Latin expression, "ERO CRAS," which means, "I will be present tomorrow."

## Thinking you don't know the "O" Antiphons? Actually, you DO!

The verses of "O Come, O Come Emmanuel" are taken directly from the "O" Antiphons! Although the traditional use of the "O" Antiphons is the seven days before Christmas, they can serve as a shared meditation throughout the Advent season in the body of the Mass. For more history or explanation of the "O" Antiphons you can search for them on YouTube and listen to them chanted in English and Latin.
