Lent begins on Wednesday. Have you thought about your Lenten resolutions and penances yet? Think about it today, otherwise, this holy season will have begun and you won't get into the swing of things until week two or three. This seems to happen to me every year, so I know from experience that it's important to consider it before Ash Wednesday.

We are having a parish retreat this coming Friday evening and Saturday. This retreat is called "The Proclamation," and it is being led by Fr. Bryan Kujawa. He does an amazing job with this retreat, and I hope that you all will attend at least some of it. Please see the posters on the doors for more details. If you want this Lent to be a fresh start, and if you want to be utterly convinced that God loves you, this retreat is just what you need.

The Handmaids of the Altar will have their first meeting on Saturday, February 24 after the 9:00 am Mass. Uniforms are not needed for this first gathering. We are going to be trying out hand at baking hosts for Mass. There are printouts in the entry to help you order the uniforms for the young ladies, and for families with tight finances, a woman of the parish has volunteered to help purchase the necessary items.

Saint Joseph's day is coming up in March. Some of us have a custom of making a 33-day consecration to St. Joseph, just like so many people do with the Blessed Mother. This is a Leap Year, so the proper day to begin your consecration to St. Joseph this year is on Friday, February 16th. 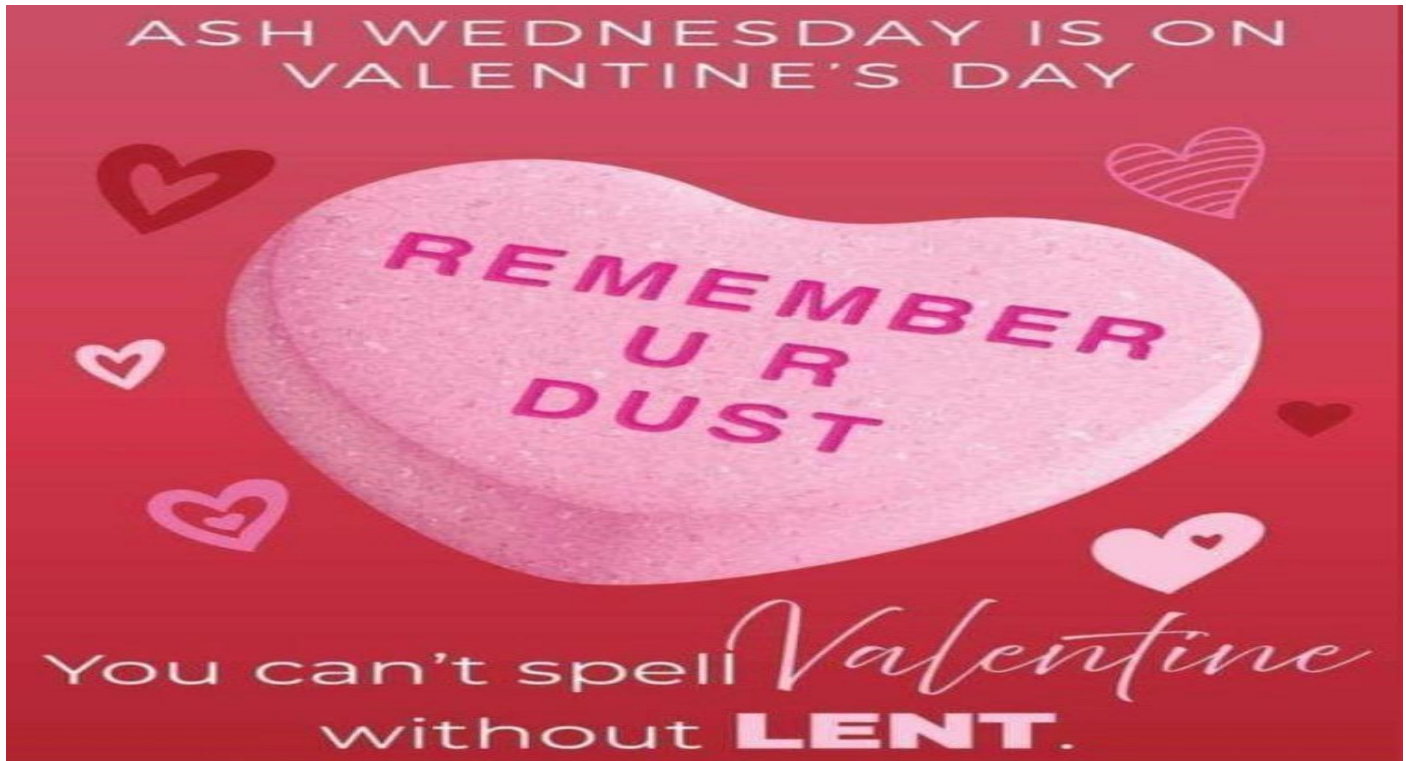


The FACC Committee will have their soup and sandwich meals during Lent on Friday March 1st and March 15th. Join them for fellowship.

The 40 days of Lent remind us of the time when Christ retreated into the desert. It's a time of reflection, repentance, and God calling us back to the vitality of our interior spiritual life. The world around us is so busy and loud. During Mass in Lent, we want to create an atmosphere of recollection - a retreat to the desert place where Christ is now traveling. It's an atmosphere that's uniquely peaceful, restful, and thoughtful.

I've heard it said that you're really close to someone if you can be comfortable in each other's presence while not saying a word. Can we sit in the presence of the Lord in silence?

Personally, I struggle with being "Little Miss Small Talk Queen." I often feel the need to fill ALL conversational voids at ALL times! So, for me, the journey to peaceful silence has been challenging, yet it's also been beautiful. The healing grace of God meets any negative voices in my heart and silences them. In the depths of my soul, He can calm my interior storms. No one and nothing else can do that for me.

Scripture also tells us how God's voice was a still, small voice best heard in the silence. That's what we're going to try and create this Lent: an atmosphere to hear that still, small voice and to learn to sit in the quiet comfort of a dear friend.

Beginning next Wednesday, Ash Wednesday, all singing will be acapella. This means the organ and all other instruments will be waiting for the glory of Easter to arrive. What grandeur it will be when our Lord rises from the dead! We will also be singing the Communion antiphon, followed by a hymn when needed.

We'll be using the Latin Mass parts in the Gather hymnal starting with #316 Sanctus, #316a, #316b, and #320. We'll also be using a Gospel Acclamation that Fr. Hamness composed as part of our Lenten retreat.

If you want to take a listen and sing along, all of these Mass parts and the Gospel Acclamation have been recorded and posted on my YouTube channel: **T Splon**. Simply type that into the YouTube search bar, and the channel should be the first one at the top to click.
