FROM THE DESK OF FR. HAMNESS

The observance of Lent is meant to serve as commemoration of the suffering of Jesus Christ. The word has been in use in English in this capacity since at least the late 13th century, and also may be found used in slightly generalized fashion, to indicate a period of fasting in any religion, or to refer to a longer period observed by some Eastern Orthodox churches.

Lent comes from the Middle English word lente, meaning "springtime," which is itself descended from the Old English lenc-

For those who prefer their ecclesiastical terminology to be as polysyllabic as possible, the word Quadragesima may be used as a synonym of Lent; this word comes from the Latin Quadragesima's ("fortieth"), and also refers to the first Sunday in Lent.




