Reflections for Sunday Year B by Paula Gooder

There is at present a growing fascination with genealogy. More and more families are tracing their ancestors, digging back into the past to see what has made them the people they are. Often this search leads to some interesting surprises and the discovery of long -lasting relatives-and their sometimes shady past.

Today we consider that we are children of Abraham. This is an astonishing and bold claim; that our genealogy as Christians is shared by many and goes back many generations. Our bloodline-as the first chapter of Matthew lists in the genealogy of Jesus- is a rich and varied one. But Paul focuses on Abraham and reminds us of just what a wonderful example he is.

Here is Paul at his most generous and inclusive- as a follower of Jesus Christ, but also recognizing that his inheritance goes back much further and wider. He cites Abraham as a model and an example to follow. During his long wait, Abraham's faith must have been severely tested and challenged, but he remained faithful to God. He must have wondered if there would be any fruit or purpose to his life. For Abraham there were no quick results, but deep faithfulness.

We share this inheritance. Today we thank God for the rich and diverse family of which we are a part, for those who are not like us, for those who are surprisingly different yet connected through this incredible picture of unwavering faithfulness.
