### From the Desk of Father Hamness

On the Fourth Sunday of Lent, also known as Laetare Sunday (Rejoice Sunday), flowers may appear on or near the altar and the organ may be played as a solo instrument; during the rest of Lent, these things are not permitted. Priests are given the option to wear rose-colored vestments at Mass held on this day in place of the violet vestments normally worn during Lent. The term "rose" is used to describe this lighter shade of the color violet in the Roman Rite. This Sunday is considered a day of relaxation from normal Lenten rigors; a day of hope with Easter at last within sight. Traditionally, weddings (otherwise banned during Lent) could be performed on this day as well. Another name for this Sunday is "Mothering Sunday" because Christians have been encouraged to visit their "Mother Church," the church in which they were baptized, to give thanks to God for their new life in Christ. Perhaps you might take an hour this afternoon and pay a visit to your mother church!

The Introit of the Mass (also known as the Entrance Antiphon or Entrance Song) specified for today has the following words: *Rejoice with Jerusalem; and be glad for her, all you that delight in her: exult and sing for joy with her, all you that in sadness mourn for her; that you may nurse, and be satisfied with the breasts of her consolations. I was glad when they said unto me, We will go into the house of the Lord.* This sets the theme for today's Mass. The theme is to rejoice and to be glad when you visit the house of the Lord! Keep this in mind if you are able to visit your mother church today.
