From the Desk of Father Hamness:

Passiontide (in the Christian liturgical year) is a name for the last two weeks of Lent, beginning on the Fifth Sunday of Lent, long celebrated as Passion Sunday, and continuing through Lazarus Saturday (i.e. Holy Saturday). It commemorates the suffering of Christ (Latin passio = "suffering"). The second week of Passiontide is Holy Week, ending on Holy Saturday.

In the Roman Catholic Church, all crucifixes and images may be covered in veils (usually violet, the color of vestments in Lent) starting on Passion Sunday: Crosses are to be covered until the end of the celebration of the Lord's passion on Good Friday. Statues and images are to remain covered until just before the Easter Vigil. The veiling was associated with the scene in the Gospel of John (8:46–59) in which Jesus "hid himself" from the people.

" I will be their God and they shall be my people." -Jeremiah 31:33


