The process by which an unbaptized adult becomes a Catholic is called the Order of Christian Initiation of Adults (O.C.I.A.) People that have been baptized and raised as Protestants are also incorporated into the Catholic Church by this process. Part of O.C.I.A. is that on the Third, Fourth, & Fifth Sundays of Lent there is a special ceremony added to the Mass when there is someone joining the Church who has not yet been baptized. The unbaptized person who wishes to join the Church (The Elect) undergoes on these Sundays the Scrutiny's. They are prayers of exorcism which are intended to help purify the Elect from sin and sinful desires. The overall prayers and laying on of hands are to help the Elect be enlightened by the Word and grace of God.

The basic structure which takes place immediately following the homily:

- -The elect (with sponsors) are invited forward
- -Invitation for parish to silently pray for the elect
- -Intercessions for the elect
- -Prayer of exorcism
- -Laying on of hands on the elect
- -Prayer over the elect

In Callaway, we do not have someone to be baptized this year, but in Frazee we have Thomas Kettlehut. Please keep him in your prayers. Please also pray for Ken Hammer, who was baptized as a child and will be received into the fullness of the Catholic Church at the Easter Vigil.

Liturgy of the hours: week III of the Psalter

Reflection on the Gospel —In today's gospel, Jesus performs a protest in the temple. He quotes the prophet Zechariah, who spoke of an ideal day when there would no longer be traders in the house of God (Zech 14:21). It may be that Jesus is challenging the attitudes of economic exchange that underlie sacrificial thinking: if we offer this sacrifice to God, then God will forgive our sins or bestow blessings. Repeatedly the Scriptures counter this tit-for-tat notion telling how God's love and gifts are offered unconditionally.—Living Liturgy, third Sunday of Lent 2024

Sunday—12:15 pm—Latín (N.O.)


