From the Desk of Father Hamness:

What is the deal with the Easter Bunny and why does a rabbit lay eggs?

When Christianity was spreading through the world, Christian missionaries, instead of coming to a new culture and declaring everything wicked and horrible and making the people abandon every single thing they ever knew if they wanted to be Christians, made use of what they could in each culture that they were attempting to evangelize. When Christians missionaries came to England, for example, they encountered a people who worshipped many different gods and goddesses of nature. In the Spring of the year they had special festivities in honor of Eostre (the goddess of the Spring and the dawn). While the missionaries were working amongst the people in England, when they were talking about the Resurrection of Jesus, and the time of year that it occurred (in the Spring) it was viewed as quite harmless to let the local people continue to call that time of year according to their usual custom. The missionaries insisted however, that now this time of year was in honor of Jesus Christ and his Resurrection, and not in honor of a false goddess. What they did is "Christianize" the pagan culture, by reassigning customs from that culture to the One, True God.

The Easter Bunny comes into play because there was an ancient legend that the goddess Eostre (Easter) once rescued a bird that was frozen to a tree branch in the Spring, and to rescue the bird she turned it into a hare. The bird (now hare) was accustomed to laying eggs, so it continued to do so, even as a bunny, and in gratitude it offered the eggs to those who honored the goddess who had saved it. Eventually, Christians took this cultural detail and transformed it into the Easter Bunny who gives eggs and presents to everyone in honor of the Resurrection of Christ.

Which customs from our culture can we Christianize?
