From the Desk of Father Hamness:

There is an exciting opportunity to hear a profound Catholic priest speak on Tuesday, April 16th in Bemidji. This is an event especially designed for parishioners who are on pastoral or finance councils as well as for parishioners who are highly engaged with their parishes.

Fr. James Mallon, author of Divine Renovation: Bringing your Parish from Maintenance to Mission will be offering a session for parish lay leaders, staff, and deacons on Tuesday night, April 16th, at 7:00 pm at St. Philip's in Bemidji. Fr. Mallon will be meeting with our priests from Monday to Wednesday that week during their annual study days to share his approach that is internationally recognized for renewing parishes so Catholics move from a maintenance to a missionary mindset, and thus refocusing parishes "...from membership-based communities to assemblies of disciples of Jesus who proclaim and share the good news with all peoples." This is an important part of the roll out of our new pastoral plan for the diocese, which will be shared soon. The Tuesday evening, April 16 event will allow us to hear about the vision of parish renewal that the priests will be immersed in during their study days.

I hope that some of our parishioners can set aside that evening to attend! Make a date night of it! There is a wonderful Italian restaurant in Bemidji that I recommend.
