The most important feast days of our religion traditionally have an octave associated with them. An octave is a period of eight days, and it is used to dig deeper into the event or person that is being celebrated and to extend that celebration for a week-long period. The Octave of Easter is closed the following Sunday with celebrations of Divine Mercy. The Octave of Christmas is closed a week later with the Solemnity of Mary, the Mother of God on New Year's Day. The Octave of Pentecost draws to a close after one week's time with the Solemnity of the Most Holy Trinity, which is where we are today.

Pentecost honors the coming of the Holy Spirit, which we have been chewing on this whole week, and we swallow it down with this day honoring The Most Holy Trinity. The Fathers of the Church have thought it important to remind us of the Trinity, because of times in the past when some Christians began to slip into false beliefs about the Holy Spirit, and about Jesus. At various times, people began to wrongly believe that Jesus was just a man, not God himself, and that the Holy Spirit was not a real person, but just a vague power of God. In other words, people sometimes slipped back into the Jewish belief system where God is not a Trinity, but just a singular, all-powerful deity. That is not the Christian belief. Our God is triune. He is One God in three persons. This is difficult for us to comprehend, but understand it we must, because that is who God has said he is: Father, Son, and Holy Spirit!

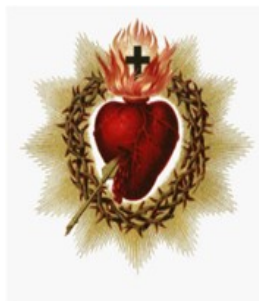
