Eucharistic Adoration is a great blessing and a great responsibility. If you are presently committed to an hour a week/month please invite others to come spend time with Jesus. “He instructed them to take nothing for the journey but a walking stick – no food, no sack, no money in their belts.” Mark 6:8

Imagine taking nothing but a stick when you go on a trip. The Apostles must have really trusted in God’s providential care. Think of all the material things “we can’t live without” in today’s world. We make our life’s journey more difficult because of all the material baggage that we drag along. Putting God first in everything and putting our money and possessions second gives us freedom because we don’t become “slaves” to wanting to acquire more things.

Reflection on the Gospel

In today’s gospel, Jesus sends his disciples out on the first foray in mission. He sends them in pairs, because evangelization is a communal endeavor. And they are to pack nothing, going completely empty-handed. This is a totally different model of mission than one in which the persons sent consider themselves to have a whole cache of “goods” to share with people who have nothing. A Christian missionary must be needy, vulnerable, so that there can be a mutual exchange of gifts. Sharing the gospel is always a two-way street.

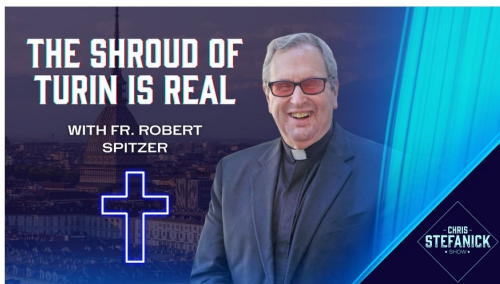
