In a few weeks, our parishes will be visited by Father Christon Muhero. He is from Africa, from the Archdiocese of Blantyre in the nation of Malawi, but he is presently serving in our diocese in Warroad, Williams, and Baudette. The Diocese of Crookston is excited to be in the early stages of a special relationship with the Archdiocese of Blantyre.

Bishop Cozzens has pledged our support for an ongoing Mission Appeal to construct a rural secondary school where 17,000 primary students in the Blantyre Archdiocese do not have access to a high school. Some parishioners from our diocese are members of an organization called TTE (Transformation Through Education), which is leading this project. The school will open its doors this fall to 200 students - 100 young men and 100 young women. Please be generous!



We are providing this information now, so that when Fr. Christon comes to share his testimony at Mass, you will have already had some time to consider a donation to this good cause.

Jesus couldn’t do any mighty deeds in his hometown because of his own people’s limited expectations. Thinking they knew Jesus inside and out, they prevented God’s power from working through him. This is a version of “tall poppy syndrome”, where an individual leader is prevented from rising from within a group, which takes a “Who do they think they are?” attitude, while an outside “expert” with the same ideas or gifts would be taken far more seriously. Perceptions and expectations, opposition and close-mindedness can squelch the flow of the Spirit.



# Dear Padre

July 7, 2024

***My Protestant friends asked me why we call priests "Father" when Jesus said not to. I don't know how to answer.***

Jesus instructs his disciples, "As for you, do not be called 'Rabbi.' You have but one teacher, and you are all brothers. Call no one on earth your father; you have but one Father in heaven" (Matthew 23:8-9). Taken in context, Jesus is denouncing the scribes and Pharisees for bestowing honors and titles on themselves. If taken literally, this passage would also prohibit us from calling our biological fathers by that name, or our instructors "professor."

Jesus assures us that God is Father of us all. The early Christian community adopted family terms—father, mother, brother, sister—to show their affiliation through baptism and their mutual faith in the Lord (See Luke 8:21, "My mother and my brothers are those who hear the word of God and act on it.")

Thus, St. Paul refers to Timothy as his "child in faith" (1 Timothy 1:2; Philippians 2:22). He also tells his Christian converts, "I am writing...to admonish you as my beloved children. Even if you should have countless guides to Christ, yet you do not have many fathers, for I became your father in Christ Jesus through the gospel" (1 Corinthians 4:14-15). Like St. Paul, who speaks of himself as a father in nurturing the faith, priests are called "Father" for their pastoral role in the Church. ●

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


## The True Bread | Bread of Life | Episode 5
