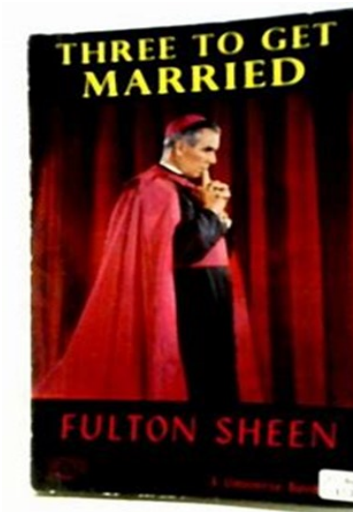

The following people or their family has asked us to pray for them:

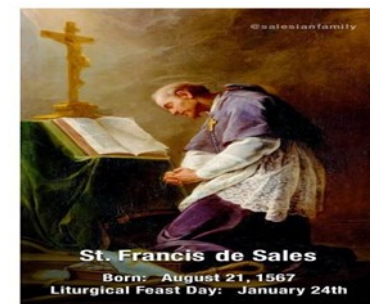

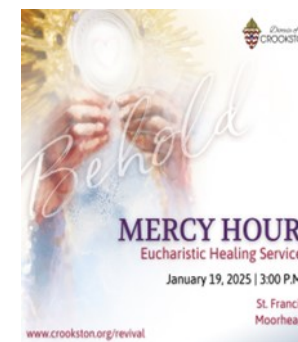
