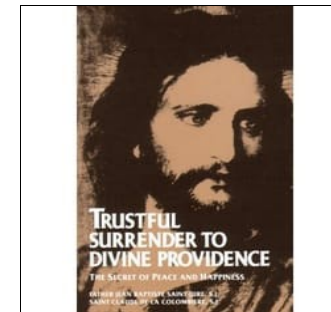

“But rather, love your enemies and do good to them, and lend without expecting anything back...” - Luke 6:35

Easier said than done, right? But if we are to imitate Christ, most of us need to practice mercy and compassion more frequently. Start with the little daily annoyances that we experience, the unkind word or hateful glances we receive. Instead of plotting revenge on that person, try saying a quick prayer for that person. Praying for our enemies doesn't change them, it changes us. Mercy and compassion will keep us on the path to holiness.

Question of the week?

What is the most difficult for me: turning the other cheek when I have been hurt or wronged, refrained from judging others, or giving without repayment? How will I change my thinking and behavior?

Reflection on the Gospel

The final verses in the gospel may at first seem to say that we will be treated by God the way we treat others. But the two previous verses (vv.35 and 36) give us as the starting point God's unearned goodness and mercy toward us. What enables us to be compassionate, non judgmental, forgiving, and giving is that God has been that way with us. Such divine action in us then shapes our ability to measure the way God does.
